Hooked up

Seattle-founded Redhook may now be a big-name player in the national beer scene, but the powerhouse's new Redhook
Brewlab in Capitol Hill is aimed squarely at hard-to-please craft beer fans who relish that first fresh sip of an experimental brew. Fast-moving bartenders hand out lab-exclusive pints from 16 rotating taps, the suds coming via overhead tap lines straight from a gleaming brewery viewable through floor-to-ceiling windows. Designed by Graham Baba Architects, the folks behind state-of-the-art projects like Chophouse Row, it's a tavern with elements to suit every mood.

You can dine on a wood-fired chorizo sausage pizza at the U-shaped bar, lounge with friends in a booth, or find some seclusion in one of the brick-flanked nooks. On sunny days, Brewlab's outdoor patio adds another layer of hop-infused bliss. redbook.com.

BAINBRIDGE ISLAND EAT / There's plenty of great pizza in Seattle, yet more than a few residents are taking the ferry to visit Bruciato, the brick-and-mortar version of Brendan McGill's Monday night pop-up. McGill and his pizzaiolo, Brandon Thompson, take their craft seriously-starting the dough with long-fermented wild yeast, topping it with San Marzano tomatoes and housemade salumi, and baking their pies in an oven shipped from Naples. Pizzas rotate seasonally; look for the Spagnola, gilded with Basque-style chorizo, confit potato, and Padrón peppers. pizzeriabruciato.com.

sip / Overcast spring weather getting you down? Take a hint from the often-gloomy British Isles and break for afternoon tea. At **The Heathman Hotel**—an Anglophile inn near Lake Washington—you can order a cup of orchid oolong to enjoy alongside cucumber sandwiches, salmon rillettes, and harissa deviled eggs.
